Commander's Message:

The long cold winter is finally over – Welcome Spring!

On March 2, 3 we went to Albany for Hill Day where we met with our State Senators and Assemblymen representing Erie County and asked for their help in passing bills to benefit Veterans. This year we want to help Veterans with the performance of a study regarding homeless Veterans in the State of New York. Also Resolution #33 requests the Governor and New York State Legislature create and fund a Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) and Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) Biological Repair Treatment and Recovery Law. Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy Treatment (HBOT) is being looked at. It has been internationally recognized as a viable treatment for mild TBI and PTSD at an overall lower cost of treatment than a lifetime of unproven prescription drugs.
