"Indivisible" presents a 100th Anniversary fundraising opportunity for posts, which can buy bookazines in bulk and resell them to members or the public. Bulk orders of 25 or more books cuts the price to \$7.95 each. You are encouraged to buy the bookazine in bulk and distribute to schools or libraries, or use as a fundraiser, all while sharing the story of the bookazine and the organization's role in the history of the American flag.

As of this writing there are 773 calendars distributed to 18 Posts around Erie County. Of those, 336 have already been sold. If we can sell the remaining 437 calendars that are already out there, we would exceed last year's sales by over 50 calendars. And in that case, based on some statistics and assuming a fair lottery drawing, there would be a 98% chance that we'd make a profit of at least \$9500.

By the time you read this, there will be less than a month left to sell those remaining calendars, so I ask everyone to please do your best to continue selling. Remember that the money we make is used to support the County's many worthwhile programs and functions. Qualified Erie County contestants are asked to please arrive by 11:15 AM. In case of bad weather, the snow date will be Sunday, December 13, at the same place and time. The Erie County winner will receive a \$200 check and their home school will receive a \$100 check. The runner up will receive \$50. The winner and runner-up will advance to the 8th District Oratorical contest which will be held on Sunday, January 10, 2016 at 12:00 PM at the Milton J. Brounshidle Post # 205 located at 3354 Delaware Avenue, Kenmore, NY 14217, with a snow date scheduled for Sunday, January 17, 2016 at the same place and time. Winners will then advance to the state level for further competitions.

To enter the competition, completed entry forms must be submitted **no later than Friday**, **November 27, 2015**. Late entries will be disqualified. Be sure the registration forms are filled out properly and the proper certifications are signed as appropriate. I will complete the section on the High School registration form marked "For County Chairman Only."
