From Department's 2-10-15 Membership Report: Congrats to our top Posts: East Aurora at 103.55%, Sardinia Post at 102.63% and Grand Island Post at 101.08% for a total of 17 members over 100%. Thank you for all you do each day for membership and keep up the great work. Congrats also to Newcomb-Long and Donovan Post for being over 95% of goal. Erie County is now at 81.78% of goal. Our next target is 90% by 3-9-15 with the next two cutoff dates of 2-23-15 and 4-13-15. All Posts: be sure to send in a "CERTIFICATION FORM POST 0001 AND DMS TRANSFER LISTING" form, which shows all of your transfers from Post 0001 for 2014-2015. It's best to fill out this form and mail to Department to be sure all of your transfers are counted toward awards at Convention. The form can be found at the head table during the next several County meetings and on Page 22 of the Department's Membership Program & Awards Manual 2014-2015. Fill out the FRANK J. PETERS DEPARTMENT COMMANDER'S PIN "I Got One!" form (available at the next several County meetings and on page 20 of the 2015 Awards Manual) for each of your new members and send this form in to Department for Commander Frank's pin (no limit on number of pins requested). National Commander Mike Helm will award his National Commander pin to any American Legion Family member who obtains three new members or renews five members into The American Legion. To maintain the integrity of the National Commander's pin incentive program, only one pin will be awarded per individual. Thank you for all you do each day for Membership. Our new member total for Erie County is now at 230 with a self-imposed goal of 300. Every member recruit a new (or re-instated) member to help reverse the downward trend of membership over the last many years. Let's keep The American Legion strong into the future for our Legion family and all veterans.

In a resolution passed at the 1960 National Convention the American Legion declared February to be Americanism Month, the month when we should renew our efforts to "foster and perpetuate a 100 percent Americanism". I'm embarrassed to admit that I was not aware of February's significance in the Legion. (My thanks go to Vice Commander Wayne Sorrentino for giving me the heads up.)

During Department Commander Frank Peters' recent visit to Erie County, he mentioned the importance of each Post completing and submitting their Consolidated Post Report (CPR). As he pointed out, if only half the Posts send in a CPR, then he only has half the story when trying to inform legislators about all the good work done by the American Legion. This data shortfall also impacts the National Commander's presentations to Congress.

So, to those Posts who are not in the habit of submitting a CPR each year, I ask you to please try to do so this year. Don't worry about how many items you can check off on the form. As it says in the instructions: "If the post only has one program, then that should be the one reported." Every little bit adds to the overall picture of the Legion's impact on our communities. One-third of the CPR is dedicated to Americanism items.

I urge the Americanism chairperson at each Post to take a look at the form (available from the Department web site or from our County office) and choose just one activity for your Post to undertake. You'll have one (or one more) item to add to your CPR submission and you will have added to the body of good works performed by your fellow Legionnaires.
