I hope you all had an amazing Veterans Day! Thank you all for your service to our Nation. To our Brother and Sister Marines, Happy 241st Birthday to the United States Marine Corps! I represented Erie County at the Clarence Senior Center on 11/10 to present to Legionnaire Marty Helowicz, of Clarence Post #838, an American Legion Department of New York Red, White, and Blue Award for his efforts in fostering a greater sense of Americanism and patriotism in his community. Congratulations Marty! If any Posts want to recognize an individual or organization with a Red, White, and Blue Award, submit the application form to me for review.

On 12/1, we celebrate on 12/1, the 75th Birthday of the USAF Auxiliary, Civil Air Patrol (CAP). Founded 12/1/1941, just before America entered World War II, by Gill Robb Wilson and with Major General John F. Curry appointed as its first national commander, CAP was tasked with aiding the war effort by using civilian aviation resources for many missions including anti-submarine patrol and warfare, border patrols, and courier service. During World War II, CAP's coastal patrol flew 24 million miles, found 173 enemy U-boats, attacked 57, hit 10 and sank 2, dropping a total of 83 bombs and depth charges throughout the conflict. By the end of the war, 64 CAP members had lost their lives in the line of duty. This all volunteer organization continues today as part of the Air Force's Total Force concept and has a three-fold mission of emergency services, aerospace education, and cadet programs.
