#### Americanism – VC Ted Balbierz

I was recently asked to participate as a member of the WNY VA Healthcare Advisory Board that met as a Zoom conference on Thursday 2/3. During the conference members of the VA Community Engagement and Partnership Coordinators facilitated a presentation on Veteran Suicide Prevention. We have all heard the very disheartening 22 a day statistic. During the PowerPoint the facilitators discussed services available to those Service members who are in "Crisis". Common reasons for Veterans Crisis are: Loss of Camaraderie (Feeling Lost or Alone), No Sense of Purpose (Loss of Mission), Loss of Income & PTSD.

This got me thinking and I asked the following questions: What is the DOD & VA doing to prevent Veterans from getting to the crisis point? My next question seemed to trigger an a'ha moment with the facilitators... What is the DOD and VA doing to encourage Veterans to Participate in Veterans Service Organizations such as the American Legion, VFW & DAV? Service Organizations such as the American Legion were built upon a foundation of Continued Camaraderie & Purpose which are two of the primary reasons for Veterans considering their final discharge.

There would be no VA care or benefits without the American Legion. Has the system grown so large to have missed the innate benefits that Veteran Service Organizations have to offer? Immediately upon completion of the Zoom, both coordinators requested a follow up meeting to discuss the potential benefit of encouraging Veterans in joining their local VSO's and I have participated in one follow up meeting to date. We as Brothers & Sisters in Arms, have all been there before and further consideration must be given to encouraging the stepped-up marketing of VSO's such as the American Legion as an extension of service, to provide all Veterans with a Continued Sense of Commitment and Camaraderie to provide what is missing and assist in preventing crisis to begin with. From Basic Training thru Discharge and beyond promotion of VSO's can and should have an impact to reduce the 22 a Day.
